Nanni Moretti directs this intimate personal drama starring Margherita Buy as a film auteur (also named Margherita) who must come to terms with the impending death of her mother, while shooting her latest project. In the process, Margherita is forced to confront fraught relationships with family members, including her brother (Moretti), a troublesome exboyfriend, and a feckless Italian-American actor (John Turturro).

The life of a bourgeois family in Rome is upset by the announcement that the son, Andrea, wants to enter the priesthood. His father Tommaso, a cynical atheist, will do whatever it takes to avoid this, even if it involves tailing the charismatic, unconventional Father Pietro—the priest who, he believes, has brainwashed his son. Edoardo Falcone's first feature film, *Se Dio vuole*, is a hilarious and irreverent comedy about family, religion, and finding one's own place in life.



Palio is named for the magnificent and harrowing horse race whose origins in medieval Siena have been kept alive to this day. As suspenseful as a thriller, this beautifully filmed documentary offers breathtaking scenes of horses racing across the Tuscan landscape, as well as along the perilous track of the 14th century Piazza del Campo. Adding depth and context to the film is a behind-the-scenes look at the stories of two jockeys, and the machinations of the event which has come to define Sienese life.
